From Fr. Tony

This past Tuesday, the church celebrated the memorial of the Holy Name of Mary. As I was reflecting on this memorial, I thought I would share something that we should be doing all along, bowing at the names of Jesus, Mary, and the saints. At some point in the future, I hope to share more of this in my homily, but I wanted to get this info out to you now. It comes from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, p.275:

A bow signifies reverence and honor shown to the persons themselves or to the signs that represent them. There are two kinds of bow: a bow of the head and a bow of the body.

a) *A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated (for example, this past Wednesday we celebrated St. John Chrysostom).*

b) *A bow of the body, that is to say, a profound bow, is made to the altar [after we genuflected coming into the church, during the Creed, and during different prayers of the priest].*

Therefore, as we honored Mary this past Tuesday and Our Lady of Sorrows on Friday, may we always honor her and show reverence to her with this special sign of our love and admiration. Because when we show devotion to Mary and the saints, it is our Lord that we are worshipping through them.

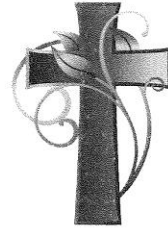
